

## How should I safely dispose of my SHARPS?

**Never flush SHARPS** (syringes, needles or lancets) or toss them in the trash.

State law requires they be placed in a red or yellow approved Sharps bio-hazard container for transport to the Delta Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility. We will properly dispose of your sharps.

### **Protect your privacy**

Use a dark marking pen and delete your name or any personal information before dropping off unwanted medications.

Expired or unused pharmaceuticals pose a danger to your family, community and the environment. We are here to protect the local environment by providing a **free** pharmaceutical collection service to residents of **East Contra Costa County**. Bring your unwanted medications to:



## What's in your bathroom cabinets?

Do you have a collection of prescription and over-the-counter medications which have expired or are no longer used?



- Children and the elderly are frequent victims of accidental poisonings from medications in their homes.
- More teens abuse prescription and overthe-counter drugs than any illicit drug except marijuana.
- Traces of medication have been found in water samples all over the country.
- Research has linked pharmaceutical pollutants to reproductive defects in fish, resistance to antibiotics and the development of drugresistant germs.

### Why can't I flush them?

Never flush medications down the toilet.

Many drugs are water soluble and can harm our local ecosystems and aquatic life.

Wastewater treatment facilities are not equipped to remove all traces of pharmaceutical chemicals.

Flushing medicine down the toilet can result in contaminants reaching our local waterways and the Delta!
